Model, hand carved wooden cabin, complete with furnishings. Cabin is based on a house in Petrovsk Yaroslavl Oblast, Russia. Functioning doors and shutters. Although

most Russians now live in modern flats, every Russian still knows what an izba is. Izba, a traditional log hut and the main dwelling type for Russian peasants, is widely featured in folklore.
