Yorkshire slipware, earthenware clay

### Description

A terracotta colored ceramic whistle in the shape of two birds in a double handle vase with a flower. Yorkshire slipware refers to a type of decorated earthenware pottery made in the Yorkshire region of England. "Slipware" means it was decorated with "slip"—a liquid mixture of clay and water that can be trailed, painted, or poured on the surface.
